

SEX ON THE SCHOOL CALENDAR 2026-2027

Sex on the school calendar has become commonplace all over the nation. Sexuality-themed events are cropping up in MA schools, often facilitated by GSAs (Gender and Sexuality Alliances). Will any of these dates be observed in your district? Find out. Oppose the sexualization of children in school.

BISEXUAL AWARENESS WEEK – Sept 16-23

Celebrates people who are sexually attracted to males and females. Culminates with Celebrate Bisexuality Day (Sept. 23rd).

LGBTQ HISTORY MONTH – October

Celebrates LGBTQ-identifying individuals as “heroes” and falsely asserts historical figures like George Washington Carver and others were gay.

BANNED BOOKS WEEK – Oct 4-10

Celebrates “freedom to read” and promotes obscene books to teens containing substance use, incest, rape, gender confusion, graphic sex, etc.

COMING OUT DAY – Oct 11*

Encourages children to “come out” as LGBTQ in school on this day.

INTERNATIONAL PRONOUNS DAY – Oct 21

Promotes the use of transgender and gender non-conforming language.

ASEXUAL (ACE) AWARENESS WEEK – Oct 25-31

Celebrates “asexuality,” defined as a lack of interest in sexual attraction or desire. This identity label is very confusing when introduced to pre-pubescent kids, who due to their developmental stage may mistakenly self-identify as “ace.”

INTERSEX AWARENESS DAY – Oct 26

Raises awareness of intersex people who, due to a genetic or developmental abnormality, have both male and female physical traits.

TRANS AWARENESS MONTH – November

Celebrates trans-identifying and gender non-conforming people and includes activities to increase awareness and activism for these communities.

INTERSEX DAY OF SOLIDARITY/REMEMBRANCE – Nov 8*

Honors intersex people. Intersex is a medical condition, not a gender identity, but is increasingly being referenced as a way to legitimize transgender identities.

TRANSGENDER AWARENESS WEEK – Nov 13-19

Promotes the visibility of transgender-identifying and gender non-conforming individuals and legitimizes transgender ideology.

TRANSGENDER DAY OF REMEMBRANCE – Nov 20

Honors victims of violence who identify as transgender. Violence is always wrong, but this day promotes harmful transgender ideology and is emotionally manipulative.

PANSEXUAL PRIDE DAY – DEC 8

Celebrates people who are sexually attracted to males and females, and all gender identities.

NO NAME-CALLING WEEK - Jan 18-22

This weeklong emphasis claims to focus on anti-bullying measures, but is often used as a guise to promote gender and sexuality-related ideology.

WELCOMING SCHOOLS NATIONAL DAY OF READING – Late Feb (Date TBD)

Books that promote transgender ideology are read to children.

AROMANTIC AWARENESS WEEK – Feb 21-28

Focuses on people who do not experience romantic attraction, are repulsed by romance, or are not interested in romantic relationships.

INTERNATIONAL TRANSGENDER DAY OF VISIBILITY – March 31

A day celebrating and promoting transgender ideology and people who identify as transgender.

DAY OF SILENCE – APRIL 9

A day when students may be asked to remain silent to denote their allyship to people who identify as LGBTQ, or show their support in some other way. Some school districts may celebrate a “Week of Silence,” or a “Day of NO Silence” where students are encouraged to participate in out-loud activism for LGBTQ causes.

LESBIAN DAY OF VISIBILITY – APRIL 26

Honors and promotes lesbianism.

INTERNATIONAL DAY AGAINST HOMOPHOBIA, TRANSPHOBIA, AND BIPHOBIA – May 17

Honors and promotes LGBTQ ideology. Any student who objects to the ideology can be considered “phobic.”

AGENDER PRIDE DAY – MAY 19

Celebrates and recognizes people who do not identify with having any particular gender, or identify as genderless.

PANSEXUAL AND PANROMANTIC DAY – May 24

Celebrates and recognizes those who identify as pansexual or panromantic.

PRIDE MONTH – June

Honors and promotes LGBTQ ideology. Schools may host Pride parades, read LGBTQ-themed books, host a Pride assembly, etc.

**The dates for these observances do not fall during the school week. Parents should still be aware of them as they may be observed on a different day.*
